








"Matching with a Mentor" Guidance



All undergraduate and graduate students applying for an NDSGC

Research Fellowship or Bridge Fellowship will submit their application through the NDSGC's

online application portal, Submittable. If awarded, students will work one-on-one with a faculty
researcher, earning a stipend through the NDSGC. Students should seek out an appropriate
advisor who will guide their research for a pre-discussed period of time. Please contact the
NDSGC team if you have difficulty finding a mentor. (Not sure who else you should work with?

Ask your current advisor for a recommendation).

Not sure where to start? Consider the following:

1. Who is your current academic advisor?

- a. Not sure who your advisor is? Check your Campus Connection (or similar student portal), ask your department chair for assistance, or talk to the undergraduate/graduate student advisor of your college.
- b. What are your advisor's research interests?
 - i. Visit their faculty page on their department's website to learn about them.
 - Is there a resume or CV listed? These documents serve as a good starting point for understanding faculty research interests and recent projects.
 - iii. Research their past academic publications or presentations at conferences.

2. Schedule a meeting with this advisor.

- a. What should you say? Make sure you provide your potential research advisor with adequate background information. Be sure you have a solid understanding of the answers to the following questions before you meet with this faculty member.
 - i. What are you applying for?
 - ii. What is the NDSGC program?
 - iii. Where would the funding come from?
 - iv. What is their role as an advisor?
 - v. What information will you have to provide in the application?
 - vi. What are the dates and deadlines for this fellowship?
 - vii. How many hours per week will you work on your research?
 - viii. Check out our sample email template below. You must edit this to make it personal!



ND Space Grant Consortium Funding Levels



Budget - Federal & State Dollars

- 4 year Period of Performance (4/23/2020 4/22/2024)
- \$400,000 awarded to start Year 3 (half of base award)
- Year 3 starts April 23, 2022
- \$60,000 Augmentation Proposal due April 18, 2022
 - o NASA Internships, External Evaluators, Competition Teams, Eclipse

Cost Share:

- Requirement: 50% of NASA/federal dollars
- \circ Funding increases in federal dollars \rightarrow challenges in meeting match requirements
- Cost share from affiliate representative time
- Increased ask from state legislature
- Cost share potential from UND Aerospace (e.g. soft match, infrastructure)
- SG leadership in NASA's Office of STEM Engagement is working to reduce match requirements

NASA Virtual Site Visit

Purpose of Site Visit:

- Evaluation of NDSGC performance: goals/objectives, accomplishments,
 management and operations, partnerships, collaboration, impact, and areas
 of improvement relative to Space Grant goals and objectives
- Each consortium participates in one visit during period of performance

- NASA, Affiliate representatives invited! (likely ~90 min. in a.m.), UND leadership, Grants & Accounting Offices, NDSGC

Discussion from Past Meetings

Based on a question you asked us ahead of time, let's review:

- GPA: at least a 3.0 (NASA's rules)
- Majors: Who can get involved in the research?
 - All majors, except for non-AS or -BS nursing majors
- Citizenship: With federal funding, federal rules must be followed.
- What about international students?
 - Team participation is allowable, students don't receive direct funding
